## Jubilee of Hope January 19, 2025 Second Sunday of Ordinary Time

As the Universal Church looks toward the Jubilee Year 2025 (the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord), the USCCB is thrilled to support the Holy Father in this **"event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church**."

Pope Francis stated in his February 2022 letter announcing the Jubilee 2025: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision. The forthcoming Jubilee can contribute greatly to restoring a climate of hope and trust as a prelude to the renewal and rebirth that we so urgently desire..."

The Jubilee Year will offer the faithful opportunities to participate in various jubilee events at the Vatican and in their own dioceses. The great tradition of opening the Holy Door will begin when Pope Francis opens the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica on December 24, 2024. Other holy doors will be opened at the Rome basilicas of St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major and St. Paul Outside the Walls. For pilgrims who cannot travel to Rome, bishops around the world are expected to designate their cathedrals or a popular Catholic shrine as special places of prayer for Holy Year pilgrims, offering opportunities for reconciliation, indulgences and other events intended to strengthen and revive faith. https://www.usccb.org/jubilee2025



"Oh Come Let us Adore Him" **Eucharistic Adoration?** Eucharistic adoration is a Catholic devotion that involves praving in the presence of Jesus Christ, who is believed to be present in the Eucharist, also known as the Blessed Sacrament. During adoration, a consecrated host, or the Blessed Sacrament, is displayed in a monstrance, and people can sit, kneel, or stand to pray and meditate. The term "adoration" can refer to prayer in front of a closed tabernacle or in front of the exposed host. Eucharistic Adoration is every Friday at St. Alphonsus Church beginning with the 7:30am morning Mass concluding with Eucharistic Benediction at 8:00pm. All are invited to spend quiet spend time alone with the Blessed Sacrament. Would you like to be a Eucharistic Adoration Guardian for one hour a week? All Catholics in the surrounding area are invited! Please sign the book when you come in, it will be placed on the right side of the church in front of the Baptismal Font. ## Martin Luther King Jr. Day and Catholic Social Justice

Martin Luther King, Jr. Day is celebrated on the third Monday of January. It is the only federal holiday designated as a National Day of Service. Since Jesus walked this earth, the Catholic Church has been recognizing the need for Social Justice and the life and dignity of the Human Person.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes racism as: "unjust discrimination on the basis of a person's race, a violation of human dignity, and a sin against justice." Legislation is important in the perception of public morality and justice. We as Catholics need to be aware of our strength through prayer and action in influencing Social Justice.

One way to become involved is to participate in The New York State Catholic Conference. The Conference is an office of the eight diocesan bishops of NY. It is responsible for translating Catholic teachings into public policy. The conference speaks about issues that have moral and political aspects. It focuses on issues, not political parties or candidates and raises the voices of the voiceless. The following passage reminds us that this Federal Holiday is a day of service to our Catholic beliefs and actions:

## The Life and Dignity of the Human Person

**"The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred**, made in the image and likeness of God. Our belief in the sanctity of human life and the inherent dignity of the human person is the foundation for all of the principles of our social teaching. We believe that every person is precious, from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death; that people are more important than things; and that the measure of every institution or policy is whether it enhances the life and dignity of the human person.

It is this firm foundation that solidifies the Church's opposition to abortion, euthanasia, assisted suicide and other direct attacks on human life. It is the reason we work toward the abolition of capital punishment. It is the impetus behind our advocacy for adequate health care for poor mothers, children, people with HIV/AIDS and the elderly. And it is why we reject embryonic stem cell research and human cloning, procedures that destroy developing human lives and reduce the creation of human life to the manufacture of a product in service to others. As Christians, we have an obligation to defend and support the dignity of human life in all stages and in every condition.

The sacredness and dignity of human life is shared by all, regardless of sex, race, ethnicity, religious belief, disability, economic status, age or sexual orientation. Thus, respect for human life lies at the heart of the **Church's opposition to racism, discrimination and violence of all kinds.** It is likewise the basis for our support for adequate food, shelter and clothing for the poor, just wages with decent working conditions, and health care and education for immigrants.

In addition to rejecting unjust policies that threaten human life, the Church works proactively to enhance human life by supporting alternatives to abortion, such as subsidized prenatal care and adoption; alternatives to assisted suicide, such as palliative care and hospice options for the terminally ill; moral alternatives to embryo research, such as cord blood and adult stem cell therapies; and measures to reduce bullying, prevent drug abuse and rehabilitate prisoners."
