Pilgrims on the Way of Beauty: A Resource for the Jubilee for Artists February 16, 2025

Jubilee 2025 invites you to be a pilgrim of hope. For Christians, hope is anchored in the encounter with Jesus whose life, death, and resurrection reveals God's transforming love. Our hope in God is renewed constantly in the gift of the Holy Spirit, the love of the Father and the Son, who is given, even now, to the community of believers. The Holy See has designated February 16-18 to celebrate artists, and those who support and nurture artists, to a renewed hope in God. By making a Jubilee pilgrimage of hope you give thanks to God for your vocation as an artist and join in celebrating the many creative gifts that artists have given to the Church and to the world. This is a graced opportunity to join with artists of every race, language, and culture to discover or re-discover your vocation to beauty that renews the world with the gift of hope.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTION In preparation for the Jubilee for Artists, set within a year-long renewal of Christian hope, we recall the words of St. John Paul II in his Letter to Artists (LA): "Artists of every age, captivated by the hidden power of sounds and words, colors and shapes, you have admired the work of your inspiration, sensing in it some echo of the mystery of creation with which God, the sole creator of all things, has wished in some way to associate you." (Letter to Artists, no. 1).

God is the divine artist. The beauty of the natural world, the beauty of artistic works made by human hands, and the beauty of each human life finds it source in God, the divine artist. And it is God who gives to artists—poets, writers, painters, sculptors, architects, musicians, actors, craftsmen, and many others—a special vocation to beauty in the gift of artistic creativity.

CLOSING PRAYER

"Artists of the world, may your many different paths all lead to that infinite Ocean of beauty where wonder becomes awe, exhilaration, unspeakable joy. May you be guided and inspired by the mystery of the Risen Christ, whom the Church in these days contemplates with joy. May the Blessed Virgin Mary be with you always: she is the "tota pulchra" portrayed by countless artists, whom Dante contemplates among the splendors of Paradise as "beauty that was joy in the eyes of all the other saints." ... May your art help to affirm that true beauty which, as a glimmer of the Spirit of God, will transfigure matter, opening the human soul to the sense of the eternal." 

Unleash the Power of Prayer

Prayer is a conversation with God. There are five major forms of prayer recognized by the Catholic Church: Blessing and Adoration, Petition, Intercession, Thanksgiving and Praise. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "Adoration is the first attitude of man acknowledging that he is a creature before his Creator." (CCC 2628). We are reminded that God is first in our hearts and minds. Prayers of Blessing and Adoration often ask for God's grace and mercy while expressing gratitude for the gift of the Eucharist.

Prayers of Petition are personal requests to God for help and guidance. The Our Father, the Lord's Prayer is an example of a prayer of petition. These can be formal and informal. Throughout the gospels Jesus tells us to place our needs before God in prayer. In Matthew 6:9-13, Jesus tells us to trust in God in giving us the Lord's Prayer. Intercession prayers are those that ask God to help people in need through intercession. We often pray to Saints and ask for God's help through prayer to ask the sick, poor, hungry, and needy. Thanksgiving prayers express gratitude for God's blessing. In the preface of mass, we proclaim, "that it is our duty, and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks..." Prayers of Praise are prayers that praise God for who he is, our creator. They express our admiration. The Gloria is a prayer of Praise.

Prayer allows us to silence our minds and listen to God. A few types of prayer you might want to try are:

The Rosary: where we can pray for the intercession of the Blessed Virgin and meditate on the mysteries of Jesus' life.

Lectio Divina: In this prayer of "divine reading," we listen to how God speaks to us through slowly reading and contemplating Scripture or other texts.

Centering Prayer: where we silently focus on a sacred word in contemplative prayer and experience God's presence in us.

Ignatian Contemplation: This prayer encourages us to place ourselves in a scene from Scripture using all our senses and hear how God is speaking to us.

The Ignatian Examen: This prayer allows us to reflect on our day and God's presence with us.

Prayer in Scripture

The purpose of prayer can be seen in Scripture. Here are a few passages to reflect on:

Pray for healing for the sick: "Anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church and they should pray over him and anoint (him) in oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven. -James 5:14-15

Pray for wisdom for those in authority: "First of all, then I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgiving be offered for everyone, for kings and all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil in all devotion and dignity."- 1Timothy 2:1-2.

Pope Francis tells us that, "Prayer is the breath of faith; it is most proper expression. Like a cry that issues from the heart of those who believe and entrust themselves to God." Library of the Apostolic Palace 5/6/2020

Prayer for Unity: "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." Matthew 18:20
