GOSPEL MEDITATION -ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

> March 23, 2025 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent John 4:5-42

My childhood best friend was Xander Price. He was the fastest runner in school, an excellent baseball player and Jewish. Though his family wasn't intensely religious, I felt totally at home with them despite our religious differences. Everything about their Judaism seemed to undergird and strengthen my own experience of being a Catholic. I knew they didn't believe in Jesus like my family did, but I intuited somehow that Jesus was "hiding" in their religion. Like a cat moving under a blanket, ready to emerge at any moment, the Lord was hidden there in a special way.

In the Gospel for this third Sunday of Lent, Jesus says, "For if you had believed Moses, you would have believed me, for he wrote of me" (John 5:46). Stunning words, those. Moses wrote about Jesus. The way therefore that we come to know and believe in Jesus is to discover him lurking in Moses' writings. The Hebrew Scripture is the wonderful womb in which Jesus gestates within a host of images: Adam, Isaac, David, Melchizedek, the Temple, sacrificed lambs, prophets and so on. Right now, in your parish's OCIA program, soon-to -be baptized people are carefully studying where Jesus is in the writings of Moses, so that they may believe in him. This works for all of us, too, who wish to deepen our knowledge and love of Jesus.

**Lenten challenge:** Take some time to prayerfully study one of the images of Jesus listed above in the Old Testament. Identify which one you find compelling and consider why this is so. If you don't know where to start, begin with the prophet Jeremiah as an image of Jesus.



**St. Alphonsus Food Pantry** Impact Report from January 1<sup>st</sup> through December 31<sup>st</sup> in partnership with the Food Bank of Central New York. We distributed 112,726 pounds of food and 3,703 pounds of household and hygiene items. On average we

served 961 individuals monthly, which is determined by the monthly service report, 32,757 pounds USDA pounds distributed, 10,321 donated pounds distributed with a value of \$20,332.37 and 73,351 wholesale pounds distributed \$110, 491 estimated Food Bank support 685 food bank deliveries and 34 Food Bank partners to community partners in Cayuga County. We thank them for their continued partnership with the St. Alphonsus Food Pantry.

#### March 23, 2025 Why do we give alms during lent?

The word alms comes from the Latin root meaning mercy. We know that mercy is love towards someone who is suffering. Mercy can be given through forgiveness as God gives us mercy or it can be given by working toward the relief of physical and emotional suffering. It can also be exercised by the sharing of a burden. One can only think of the line from one of Father Flanigan's boys, "He ain't heavy...he's my brother."

Almsgiving, along with prayer and fasting, is one of the three traditions of Lent that enables us to follow Christ. Almsgiving allows us to make a sacrifice during Lent while supporting the needy and the work of the Church. CRS Rice Bowls can be found in all of our churches; they are friendly reminders of our Lenten tradition of giving alms. The Catholic Relief Services supports sustainable food in Indonesia, South America, and Africa. A portion of the funds raised are returned to us for use at the St. Alphonsus Food Pantry.

Giving is part of our faith, in scripture we are reminded, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" Acts 20:35. "Prayer with fasting is good. Almsgiving with righteousness is better than wealth with wickedness. It is better to give alms than to store up gold, for almsgiving saves from death, and purges all sin. Those who give alms will enjoy a full life" Tobit 12:8-9.

Giving alms, sharing what we have with those in need, is not just a good idea, something with spiritual benefits — it is our vocation, our moral obligation. Jesus taught us that we are called to give to the needy, to be merciful, and that whatever we do or do not do to even the least among us, we do to him *Mt* 25:31-46.

St. Basil the Great applied this teaching when he wrote, "The bread you do not use is the bread of the hungry. The garment hanging in your wardrobe is the garment of the person who is naked. The shoes you do not wear are the shoes of the one who is barefoot. The money you keep locked away is the money of the poor. The acts of charity you do not perform are the injustices you commit." *Catholic Courier* 

Everything we have is from God. Since everything we have is from God, we are nothing without his grace. Almsgiving is a way of passing on the gifts to those in need. Next time you pass the Rice bowl display, consider picking one up and filling it with spare change. We ask that you return it to the collection by Easter. Let this Lent bring you closer to Jesus and strengthen your faith.
