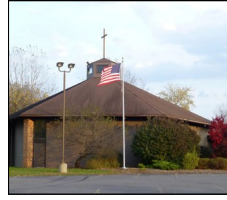

**GOSPEL MEDITATION
ENCOURAGE DEEPER
UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE**

Once at an evening Mass as a poor college student, the collection basket was fast approaching, and I only had a ten-dollar bill. I was planning on using that to buy my favorite Chipotle burrito that night for dinner. Should I keep the money? Who would know if I did? If I gave it away, what would I eat? Would I be okay? I kissed my future burrito goodbye, dropped the money in the basket, and winced. But strangely, the rest of the Mass I felt more engaged than usual. I had skin in the game. I left the Mass excited to see how God would take care of me. And he did, in amazing ways.

When the poor widow places two copper coins in the temple treasury, Jesus doesn't pity her. He praises her. He blesses her. He brags about her. He celebrates her as the temple's largest benefactor. Her giving is an act of radical, concrete trust in God. It is as if she is entering a new level of giving that excites Jesus, because she contributes not out of her abundance, but she gives **"everything she had."**

What a challenge this is to each one of us! How easy it is to ignore this! But imagine the eruption of the energy of faith, hope, and love that would be unlocked if our financial sacrifices to the Church actually tapped into daily bread and not only our disposable income. I challenge us to try this in some way this coming week and see what happens in our hearts. Even if it costs us a burrito.

St. Martin of Tours, the Catholic Connection to Veterans Day

Veteran's Day is a national holiday observed on November 11th. It is celebrated as Armistice Day and Remembrance Day. It marks the anniversary of the end of World War I which formally ended on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month in 1918. Armistice Day was renamed Veterans Day in 1954. France and Belgium celebrated Armistice Day while Canada, Great Britain, and South Africa celebrate Remembrance Day with National moments of silence at the 11th hour of November 11th.

It is no coincidence that November 11th and Veteran's Day fall on the Feast Day of Saint Martin of Tours. Saint Martin is one of the patron saints of soldiers. He was a Roman soldier who left the military to follow Christ and became a monk who dedicated his life to serving the poor and needy. St. Martin was born just after Christianity was legalized in the Roman Empire. At the age of 15 he entered the military in the Calvary Corps. Scholars believe he served as part of the Emperors Guard. During his tour, Martin encountered a beggar who was unclothed. Martin removed his cloak and cut it in half giving half to the beggar. Later Martin had a vision in which Christ appeared to him and spoke to him saying that Martin had clothed him. Martin dedicated his life to being a catechumen (one who is instructed in Christian faith). Martin left the army at 18 and became a monk becoming a conscientious objector. Later Martin was made the Bishop of Tours and worked on combating paganism and spreading the gospel. Quadragesima Sancti Martini "Advent, like Lent, used to be a 40-day period of fasting called "Quadragesima Sancti Martini" (Saint Martin's Lent). Saint Martin's Day fell the day before this fasting would begin, like Fat Tuesday for Lent, "Martinmas" as the day was commonly known, was a great day of feasting after the fall harvest and before Advent, and was marked with major celebrations, traditionally starting at the 11th hour." <https://ucatholic.com/news/catholicorigins-veterans-day/> Article by Ryan Scheel, 11.11.2017

For centuries nations at war in Europe would work to end their conflicts and sign their treaties on his November 11th feast day in preparation for Advent. In accordance with this tradition, the official armistice that ended "The Great War" or World War I, was signed on the feast of Saint Martin during the 11th hour. To remember the nearly 20 million people who died in World War I, nations began holding a yearly moment of silence and prayer at the 11th hour on November 11th. These remembrances eventually turned into what we know today as Veterans Day. As always, our Catholic heritage and beliefs influence our lives.
