GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

I recently moved into a new neighborhood. On my first evening I went grocery shopping and could not find my usual favorite Greek yogurt. Strangely, my heart started to race. All the losses of my previous life hit me. So many of my old friends, habits, comforts, and predictable experiences had fallen away. There I stood, a grown man, crying like a little boy whose world was falling apart in the dairy aisle.

This week, Jesus describes what to do when one world ends, and another begins. Does it apply to the end of time? Yes. Does it apply to the end of our individual lives? Yes. It also applies to every "world" we inhabit throughout our lives, in school, family, friendships, work, play and so on. First, the sun, moon, and stars fall. The old, familiar ways of running things suddenly stop working. Light fades. Things fall apart. It's awful. But, second, Christ comes "in the clouds." Jesus, the Son of Man, replaces those old powers with himself as the prime governing principle. Third, he sends out his angels to "gather his elect from the four winds." He re-integrates the fragments into a new integrated whole. "Summer is near," he concludes. A new world begins.

Is your world crumbling? Are your sun, moon, and stars falling from the sky? Learn to discern the pattern of the Cross and Resurrection at work in it. This is the power we touch in the Mass. Jesus is coming precisely in this transition from the old to the new world. It doesn't make our losses easy. But it does make it possible to glimpse the dawning of a summer, a new beginning, the life of the world to come.

Adoration tips:

If praying before the Blessed Sacrament seems difficult, saying formula prayers (like the Our Father, or the rosary, or litanies) can be helpful, so long as we're actually praying them rather than merely reciting.

When the disciples asked Jesus how to pray, remember, he gave them a formulaic prayer (Luke 11:1-4). But he also invites us to other kinds of prayer. "During vocal prayer," says Francis de Sales,

"if you find your heart drawn and invited to interior or mental prayer, don't refuse to take it up. Let your mind turn very gently in that direction and don't be concerned at not finishing the vocal prayers you intended to say. The mental prayer you substitute for them is more pleasing to God and more profitable for your soul."

If Jesus is trying to show you something or tell you something, don't be afraid to put down your rosary and leave your list to go with him.



The Eucharist

In receiving the sacrament of the Eucharist at Mass we give thanksgiving to God. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that, "The Eucharist is a sacrifice of thanksgiving to the Father, a blessing by which the Church expresses her gratitude to God for all his benefits, for all he has accomplished through creation, redemption, and sanctification. Eucharist means first of all 'Thanksgiving." (CC1360)

The Eucharist as the most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is full of abundant blessings. It allows us to be in the presence of the Son of God. As the real presence of Jesus, we are invited to be in an intimate relationship with him. Through the Eucharist, Jesus is with us and faithful to his promises, "I am with you always' MT 28:20. In receiving the Eucharist, we become who we receive. Jesus enables us to be more like him. We experience a spiritual transformation. We are united in fellowship with our community of believers who attend Mass and our spiritual family throughout the world.

The Catholic Connection in America

First Thanksgiving in America in St. Augustine

In an article by Dylan Reichley online, he shared that the historical records of Fr. Francisco Lopez de Mendoza Grajales share with us that a Thanksgiving Mass was celebrated on September 8, 1565, in St. Augustine, Florida with Spaniards and native Americans. This was 56 years before the Thanksgiving Mass with the Puritans. Squanto was raised as a Roman Catholic.

Catholic World Report recently reposted an article from 11-25-15 by Dale Ahlquist discussing the role of our faith in the First Thanksgiving. In the article, Ahlquist reminds us that most of the Puritans (Pilgrims) who came to Plymouth in 1620 did not survive. The Native American Squanto is credited with teaching the survivors how to fish, hunt and grow native crops. History shows that Squanto was a Roman Catholic.

Squanto was captured by Captain John Smith in 1614 and taken to Spain to be sold as a slave. Dominican Friars rescued Squanto and taught him our faith. The Friars helped Squanto return to America. Squanto was first transported to England where he met John Slaney who not only taught him English but arranged for him to get to Newfoundland. Squanto served as an interpreter between the English and Native Americans. Though he was never able to return to his own tribe who had been wiped out with the plague, he was able to come to the aid of the Plymouth settlers. Squanto used our faith to connect with the early settlers and support colonists throughout America.

With the celebration of family meals, turkey, and football and our American Thanksgiving, let us remember the elements of our faith and the role of the Eucharist in our lives. Let us make a difference.
