Living Joyfully

Sometimes it is hard to appreciate what we have until we lose it. We may take for granted for example times when we are healthy until we fall sick. Our human inclination propelled by our modern social culture is to seek gratification from material things. In the process, we often find ourselves swallowed up in selfish pursuits and miss the deeper and greater joy that comes from the realization that we are first loved by God, then family and friends.

Realizing that authentic joy can only come from the love that God shares with us, every Christmas becomes for us a time when we celebrate this love of God in Christ Jesus who is Emmanuel, God who dwells among us. The presence of Emmanuel in the world demonstrates to us that God never ceases to love and care for us so that we may be conformed to that original grace with which God created everything in the Garden of Eden and saw that it was good (Gen.1:31).

Jesus, Emmanuel, God among us chose to embrace the world and to live in it with all its brokenness so that he could restore it to wholeness. He achieved this with every encounter with the people through healing, forgiveness of sins, feeding those who had no food, grieving with those who were mourning, and by giving up his life on the cross. This is the greatest act of love that restored wholeness and joy in the world in the places it had been lost.

It is inevitable that we will as a matter of tradition and culture seek to find our joy again this Christmas from food, drink, new clothing, and material things of all kinds. Amidst all these it is important for us to pause and find true joy where it truly is, in faith in God, source of all good things, in our families and friends who reflect God's love to us. May all the good celebrations of this festive season constantly remind us of God's love, goodness, generosity, and kindness to us.

This realization is the kind that always challenges us to go out of ourselves, to be mindful of others in need and to make ourselves and our resources which we have and that come from a gracious God available to serve the needs especially of the poorest of our villages and cities. This has often been the clarion call of our Holy Father Pope Francis the chief shepherd of God's people.

When we surrender into the selflessness and simplicity displayed by the child of Bethlehem born in a manger, we bear witness to the fact that we have been truly fed by the Eucharist which we share every Sunday, Christ present to us Body, Soul, and Divinity, the bread of life that produces endless joy. Fully fed we then go out into the world singing with Joy to the world for indeed the Lord now dwells within our hearts and among us as his Body the church.

The Eucharist is Christmas every Mass.


